

ETV Student Assignments

Studio Positions

Host - The student who opens and closes the show. This student also introduces the announcers and features. This is an "on air" position.

Announcer(s) - There are usually two announcers for each broadcast. The announcers read the day's announcements to the Eisenhower community. This is an "on air" position.

Feature/Interview Host - This student introduces the shows' feature or interviews a guest. The feature may be a live interview or a video. This is an "on air" position.

Camera Operators - There are several cameras in the ETV studio. Camera operators follow the shot sheet and focus on the hosts, anchors and guests.

Floor Manager - The floor manager insures that everyone is on task and prepared for the broadcast and cues the cameras and on air personnel. The floor manager also communicates with the director, who is in the control room.

Cue Cards - These students prepare the cue cards for the show and present them during the show.

Control Room Positions

Director - This student fills out the shot sheet and makes sure that it is followed. The director is in charge of the presentation of the show.

Assistant Director - This student assists the director and checks camera shots

Video Switcher - This student takes cues from the director and decides which video source to put on air. The switcher controls a machine called a switcher.

Assistant Video Switcher - This student assists the switcher. **Video Engineer** - This student records the show and plays video tapes that are being broadcast during the show.

CG Operator - This student is in charge of the credits that run at the end of the show and any other on-screen text.

Audio Switcher - This student makes sure that on air personnel are properly miked, checks sound levels and runs the sound board during the show. The audio engineer is also responsible for the opening and closing audio.

Music - This student selects and plays the background audio and closing audio and the ETV theme at the start of the show using iTunes.

Computer Graphics - This student runs the studio's computer, displays computer graphics and plays sound effects.

Sound Effects - This student runs the studio's computer that plays sound effects.

Digital Capture - This student operates the computer that digitally captures the day's announcements and feature and prepare the files for web posting.

Closing Video - This student takes video of students entering the school the morning of the show. The footage is then used at the end of the show.

Researcher - This student does the research for the "day in history" segment of the show.

Show Log - This student logs the days show.
